



Dear Parents

This week has been our first assessment week of our end of year assessments, including the Phonics Screening Check for children in Years 1 and 2, and the Multiplication Tables Check for Year 4 pupils. Parents will receive information about their child's performance in these assessments as part of the end-of-year reports.

It has been wonderful to see the progress the children have made throughout the year, and we are very pleased with their achievements. Although the official outcomes are not yet confirmed and will be validated once the national results are published, the children should be very proud of all their hard work and effort.

In our collective worship this week, we introduced this term's Christian value of Honesty. We explored how honesty is not only about telling the truth, but also about demonstrating integrity and sincerity—qualities we will continue to discuss over the coming weeks. We reflected on the idea that winning is never worthwhile if it comes at the cost of honesty through examples of fair play in sport, including examples where teams face high-pressure relegation battles. The children also considered how they might respond to everyday dilemmas, such as accidentally breaking a mug or being tempted to cheat at school. We had some thoughtful discussions about keeping secrets and reflected on when and why it is important to share certain concerns with a trusted adult.

You should have received your child's class newsletter this week, outlining the exciting topics and learning planned for the weeks ahead.

This weekend is our Summer Fete. Thank you so much for all your generous donations and support—we are very much looking forward to seeing you there.

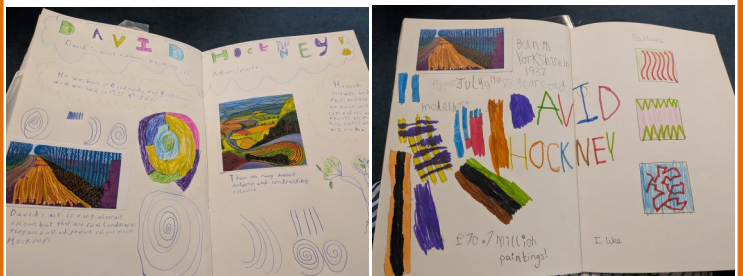
Year 3 & 4

Following on from learning about telling the time to the nearest minute last week in maths we have moved onto decimals. We began by comparing and identifying tenths as fractions, then introduced one tenth is the same as 0.1 before looking at the place value of tenths. We then compared and converted between the different representations. We are also so proud of the hard work the Year 4s have put in preparing for the MTC times table check. They all stepped up to the mark and gave it their best effort- well done every one of you!



Year 5 & 6

We have begun an art project studying the landscape paintings of David Hockney. To start with, the children researched his art and examined the colours and patterns in his work.
