Please read the information below regarding the predicted extreme heat weather warnings and the measures we are putting in place as a school. Within this week's newsletter you will be able to read about the fantastic SATs results; the highlights and memories from the year 5/6 residential and some important staffing news.

**Welcome back Mrs Wells!** On Thursday this week, we welcomed back Mrs Wells from maternity leave. Mrs Wells will be working two days a week from September; in year 1 and 2 on Thursday and in Early Years on a Friday.

## Important Notices

The Met Office has extended an amber extreme heat warning for Sunday 17th July, Monday 18th July and Tuesday 19th July as temperatures will build this weekend and early next week for much of England and Wales. With temperatures expected to be in excess of 35 degrees we have taken the following measures to ensure the safety of pupils and staff.

On Monday and Tuesday next week we are implementing the following steps:

- \* Children are encouraged to wear loose, light coloured clothing and sunhats. We are happy for your child to wear their PE kit on both days.
- \* We will be utilising the community hall as an additional classroom.
- \* Children will have an extended morning break when the weather is cooler rather than being outside at lunchtime.
- \* No PE lessons will take place on these two days.
- \* Windows will be left open and blinds kept down to keep the school well ventilated.
- \* Encouraging children to drink plenty of water.
- \* Children will only be allowed outside with a sun hat.



## SATs Success

We are really proud of our year six class for their fantastic SATs results. 100% of the pupils achieved the age expected level in mathematics with the school above national in reading, writing and maths combined.

Other notable results include 30% of the year group being awarded the higher standard in their writing with 40% achieving this in the spelling and grammar papers.
