The focus this week in our Collective Worship has continued to be Forgiveness, our value this term. We looked at different readings from the Bible which linked to forgiveness and thought about what we can learn from these to use in our everyday lives. 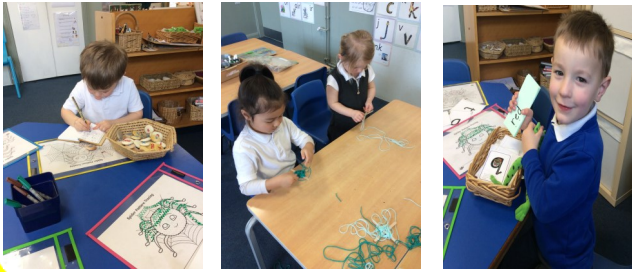


## Volunteers needed

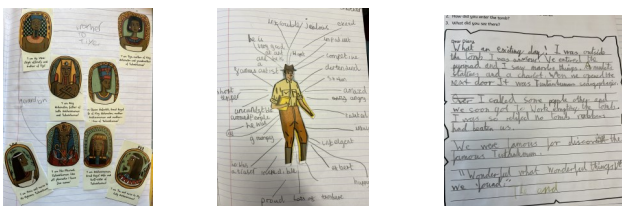
## Year 1 & 2

On Tuesday, we had a lovely visitor come and answer lots of our questions about plants, it was extremely interesting! Finally, we started creating some beautiful Easter cards in RE and even tasted some hot cross buns, they were very yummy.



## Year 3 & 4

This week our obsession with the Ancient Egyptians continues, particularly as the children have been studying *The Story of Tutankhamun* as their English text. They have been piecing together their understanding of the various characters in Tutankhamun's life, as well as learning about Howard Carter and his team of archaeologists who finally uncovered the amazing tomb of the Boy King in the 1920s. We have been studying sources to gather evidence, we have acted out the discovery of the tomb in a role play activity and we have written diary entries from the point of view of Carter. This will lead on to the children writing Howard Carter biographies next week. Today there was even some 'excavating' happening in the playground at playtime and I was shown some clues that there may be a hidden tomb somewhere in our playground!



## Year 5 & 6

We had a fun practical maths lesson learning about the mean and averages this week. We found the mean weight of some chocolate bars, the mean height of our groups and the mean of some playing cards to see who had the highest! Miss Airey has also been making too many puns about being 'mean'! Next Tuesday, we are building art models with an electric circuit. Some children would like to use cardboard boxes and similar junk modelling items for their design. If you have these items please bring them in - the children have a list in their reading records of what they need.
