Dear Parents,

Over the next few weeks we have some exciting events taking place which I wanted to bring to your attention.

On Friday 9th July we will be having the annual school Sports Day. The event will run from 13:00 through to 15:00 with Mr Wells arranging a whole host of fun challenges for the children to take part in. The government released information this week informing us that spectators will be allowed however this will need to be in line with social distancing requirements meaning that groups will need to be limited to 30. I will share more information with you closer to the date including means of entering and leaving the school safely.

The Year 5 and 6 pupils will be putting on a production of the Tempest on Wednesday 14th July at 6pm. Parents of children in Miss Phillips' class will be able to attend with our plans to hold the production outside, weather permitting.

Children in reception with have a second transition day on Thursday 15th July to ensure that they meet both class teachers.

Can I please ask that parents have children in school before 09:00. We have had a growing number of pupils arriving late during the past two weeks. It is incredibly important that children arrive on time to ensure that they maximise their learning time in school.

- Dig and plant up a new vegetable patch in tyres




Clubs for the Summer Term2 from 3.15 – 4.15pm:

BRIGADE - SCHOOL UNIFORM

If you are unsure of sizing please ensure that you order by the 5th of July – this will enable time for exchanges.







Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform, however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

- Turn garments inside out to wash and dry
- · Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
- looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough,

 Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
 - Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.

HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

CHEST: Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.

COLLAR Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth

WAIST: Measure around the natural waistline

TROUSER LENGTH. Measure the inside leg from crafch to floor without shoes on

HIPS: Measure around your hips. zoom (8") below your natural waistline.

SKIRT LENGTH: Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hern

DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH: Measure from nape of neck to length required.
