

Dear Parents,

This week we marked Pentecost Sunday by comparing the disciples to superheroes, as after the Holy Spirit came they used their power to do good and help others. It was an interesting way of getting the children to think about their own powers that they could use for good.

We also had an assembly based on road safety, linked to the Brake road safety charity, where we spoke about how we should behave when we are out enjoying a walk, and we also thought about what drivers need to be mindful of too e.g. speed, sensible parking etc. The children were very knowledgeable about the do's and don'ts when walking by a road.


Next week the Year 5&6 will be heading off on their residential, trying out some new activities and enjoying new experiences. Make sure you check your kit list over the weekend!






Year 3 & 4
