

# Charlton-on-Otmoor Phonics Parent Meeting

# Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2020









'Read, Write Inc.' is a literacy programme by Ruth Miskin.

The whole programme covers phonics, reading, writing and spelling and can be used across EY, KS1 and KS2.

Since September 2019 we have been using the RWI literacy programme to teach phonics in the FSU and Year 1/2





Read storybooks and non-fiction books closely matched to their developing phonic knowledge

Read with fluency and expression

Learn to spell using known sounds

Write confidently by practising what they want to write out loud first

Work well with a partner

One-to-one tutoring - no child is left behind.

Storybooks align with the sounds learnt in class and therefore the children are consolidating the phonics they have learnt and applying these skills in context.

## A bit of technical vocabulary...

Phoneme – spoken sounds – there are about 44 in the English language

Grapheme - how we write each of the spoken sounds e.g the spoken sounds 'f' is written using the graphemes f, ff, ph.

Red words - words that cannot be sounded out e.g. I, said, they

Green words – words that can be sounded out using our phonics

Fred talk - (Fred is the frog) he can only talk in sounds e.g. sh-o-p

Special friends- two letters that make one sound e.g. ch, th, sh

My turn, your turn- teacher teaches, the children copy

In the FSU the children move through sets 1,2 learning sounds.

#### How do phonics help us read?

Say "hello" to Fred.

Fred can only talk in sounds...

He says "c\_a\_t." Not cat.

We call this Fred Talk.



## Learning to blend and segment

Assisted blending as soon as the first 5 sounds are learnt!

Moving towards independent blending



\*Fred Fingers for spelling \*Say the word and pinch on the sounds \*Eyes for reading, \*fingers for spelling!

You can read stories with your child. Relentlessly.

Read favourite stories to your child over and over again

Listen to them reading their **reading books** every day.

Practise the sounds taught at home using the worksheets we send home.

You can practise pronouncing sounds.

Remember no 'fuh' and 'luh'!



#### You can have fun with Fred Talk.

"What a tidy r-oo-m!" "Where's your c-oa-t?" "Time for b-e-d!"
