



Dear Parents,

This week our focus was on anti-bullying. We revisited the anti-bullying charter that the children helped create last year and explored what bullying means — **“Repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group”**. We discussed how we can all ‘use our power for good’ for example speaking up against bullying and supporting others who may be affected. The Ethos Team helped by acting out scenarios that encouraged the children to think about the positive actions a bystander can take. We also spoke about common myths surrounding bullying and reminded the children of the importance of letting a member of staff know if there is ever a problem — no matter how busy we may appear.

We have also officially begun our Christmas preparations. On Monday, the Ethos Team helped set up our Christmas tree in the hall, and CAST and Breakfast Club have been busy making decorations to make the space feel festive. Advent calendars and decorations are also appearing across the school. On Wednesday, Miss Ashley began the singing rehearsals for the Nativity, and our PTA has been hard at work preparing for this afternoon’s Christmas Fair.

Alongside these preparations, we have introduced a couple of special Christmas activities. During collective worship today, I talked to the children about our Good Deeds Advent Calendar, a project created with our Kindness Ambassadors. Every child will bring home a blank Advent calendar to fill in with one good deed for each day—including Christmas Day! Suggestions from the children included washing the dishes, saying thank you, making a Christmas card, and tidying their rooms.

Other ideas could include:

- Holding the door for someone
- Telling a joke to brighten someone’s day
- Making their bed
- Drawing a picture for someone
- Leaving a surprise note
- Giving a compliment
- Giving a hug
- Feeding the birds

You will also have received an email today about our Santa Fun Run, which we will be hosting in school on the 17th of December. On Monday I will speak to the children about it and send home sponsorship forms. This event is a lovely way to support an important cause, and we truly appreciate any donations you are able to gather. Our Year 5 & 6 class will be extending their run through the village to help raise awareness as well.

Wishing you all a calm start to the Christmas celebrations.
