Nursery sharing books are changed once a week, please read them to your child to help develop their vocabulary, comprehension and recall of stories. **PE** is on Thursday afternoons.


Reception Trip and Nursery Theme Day



Phonics


<u>Reception Children</u> will be revising all of the set 1 and 2 sounds to consolidate them ready to learn set 3 in Year 1. They will be starting to read purple level books. We will continue to develop our writing, including using a capital letter to start a sentence and write a name; a full stop at the end of a sentence and their phonics knowledge to spell words.

<u>Nursery Children</u> are going to have an introduction to the Read Write Inc phonics scheme. This pre-teaching of the initial set 1 sounds will be a taster of what they will be learning in more depth as Reception pupils.

Maths

<u>Reception Children</u> will be consolidating all they have learnt in Foundation Stage, including odd/even, number bonds to 10, subitising, spatial reasoning and using what we know to solve maths problems.

<u>Nursery Children</u> will be identifying and describing shapes and talking about familiar journeys as well as solving number problems and playing number games.





Understanding the World

Our topic of Near and Far will start with FSU learning about where we live and go to school. In week 1 they will go for a walk around Charlton. We will then be comparing the countryside with a city. Next we will be learning about living further away in Kenya and Papua New Guinea and a Scottish Isle. We will end our topic with a seaside and holiday theme.







RE

In RE we will read some parables Jesus told from the bible.

Expressive Arts and Design

This half term amongst other art and craft we will be making models of homes, recreating the flags of the countries we learn about, and drawing simple maps of where we live and go to school.

In Music the children will composing and making music using percussion instruments, following symbols to represent notation.
