Dear Parents,

It is already the end of our second week back and the children have enjoyed being with their friends again. They have also started working in earnest which is great news.

#### **NEWT**

Next week the children will be writing their first NEWT (Now Everyone Writing Together) of 2019. As before, we would like you to do some pre-writing talk with your child. Research suggests that children who talk – productively and as participants in real conversations – are more proficient writers. Our observations following the introduction of Talking Homework back this up and we thank you for your support with this.

The children will be doing another piece of narrative writing. They will be using their next steps set by their teacher to improve the quality of their writing. Ask your child what their next steps are.

During this week the children will have looked at and discussed a wordless book - Tuesday by David Wiesner. A PowerPoint of it is available on our website under the section CLASSES (http://charltononotmoor.sites.schooljotter2.com/edit/5471726)

Please ask your child to tell you the story as if they are reading a written story - using high quality and varied sentence structures and vocabulary i.e. not in a chatty style with one long 'and then' sentence. KS1 children will be writing the story that goes with the pictures. KS2 children will be writing a sequel that has pigs as the characters. It would really help them if they already had some ideas of what the pigs might get up to in their story, so the more of you who get involved with this discussion the better.

We look forward to reading their wonderful stories and being amazed by their expanding vocabulary.
