This week we have spent some time focusing on looking after our precious plant, taking time from our curriculum to think about the three areas that the Eco council are focusing on this year: Waste, Marine and Community.

We began our week with an exciting start, with a visit from Cherwell District Council Waste and Recycling team, Binbo and a 32 Tonne dust cart. Parking the dust cart on the playground was quite a challenge, with only a minor disruption to the passing traffic. The children really enjoyed being able to explore the dustcart, and Binbo was big hit with everyone. Amongst the activities taking place around school, the classes made posters, sorted rubbish and many children joined me on litter picks around the village. Fingers crossed for some good weather this weekend!


