Dear Parents,

This afternoon, we had a whole school sports day rehearsal in preparation for next week. The children took part in a range of field and track events and I am pleased to confirm the following details ahead of what should be an incredibly memorable occasion.

When will Sports Day take place?

Sports Day 2021 will take place on Friday 9th July.

What time will the event start and when do we need to arrive?

Sports Day will start at 13:30 with the whole event expected to last between one hour and an hour and a half. We will be opening the gate by the field at 13:00 to allow lots of time for families to arrive without the need to form large queues.

Who can attend?

We are allowing a maximum of **2 members** to attend from each family.

How can we watch sports day?

There will be an allocated section of the field for spectators. Spectators will not be allowed to sit in groups of more than 30. These sections will be clearly visible when families enter through the field gate.

Chairs will not be provided for families. We are encouraging families to bring a picnic blanket to sit on or to bring their own chairs.

Will refreshments be provided?

Families may bring their own refreshments however we will not be selling any drinks for families on the day of the event.

Will my child be able to sit with me during sports day?

No, children will be sat in their classes for the whole event on a separate section of the field.

What will be the format for sports day 2021?

Sports Day 2021 will be slightly different from previous sports days. **Children will take part in five field events followed by a sprinting race and a long distance race. Children are to come to school in their PE kit wearing a T-shirt which resembles the colour of their house.**

Can I collect my child at the end of sports day?

We anticipate that sports day will finish close to normal home time. At the end of sports day, children will go back to their classes and get their belongings ready as would normally take place on a Friday. Parents are to head out through the field gate and walk round to the front playground as normally happens at collection time. We will then bring the children out as happens on every other school day.

How are we keeping everyone safe aligned with COVID regulations?

There are a few essential steps which must take place. These are:

- **Families must wear a mask at all times** throughout watching sports day.
- **A maximum of 2 family members**
- **Groups on the field to be limited to 30**
- **Groups to be spaced apart** from one another.
- There will be a table just inside of the gate with hand sanitisers for families to wash their hands before entering and when leaving.
- Children will be in class groups throughout the whole event.
- Children will wash their hands at the start of each field event.

Please can I finally remind all households not to turn up to watch your child if you are displaying any symptoms.

Finally, I would like to remind families that **Tuesday is our transition day**. All children are to come to school as normal. We will be joined by our two new teachers, Miss Airey and Miss Holmes. Children will be registered in their current classes before spending the day doing a whole range of transition activities in their new class.

Year six children will be undertaking a range of fun activities to ensure that the day is just as memorable and exciting.

If you are unsure of sizing please ensure that you order by the 5th of July – this will enable time for exchanges.

IMPORTANT WASH CARE INSTRUCTIONS



Always refer to your garment care label to ensure that your uniform looks as good as new for as long as possible. We produce tough, hardwearing uniform, however it is important that you follow the care labels correctly to ensure you get the best out of your purchase.

- Turn garments inside out to wash and dry
- Fasten any buttons before washing
- Do not overload machine
- Iron inside out on a cool setting to avoid heat damage, which can cause a shiny surface on fabrics (do not iron knitwear or cuffs and welts on sweatshirts)
- Bobbling/Pilling is caused by friction and excessive heat. It is also known within the British textile industry that fabric softeners are a major cause of bobbling/pilling of the fabric. Bobbling/pilling often disappears over time and is not a reflection on the quality of the garment.

HOW TO MEASURE YOUR CHILD

Measure the actual body measurements as this is far more accurate than measuring over clothes.

CHEST: Measure around the chest at the fullest part, placing the tape close up under the arms.

COLLAR: Measure around the base of the neck where the collar sits, inserting two fingers between the neck and tape to allow growth

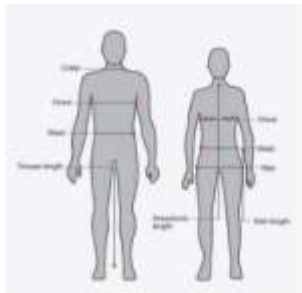
WAIST: Measure around the natural waistline

TROUSER LENGTH: Measure the inside leg from crotch to floor without shoes on.

HIPS: Measure around your hips, 20cm (8") below your natural waistline.

SKIRT LENGTH: Measure from the waist down to where you would want the hem.

DRESS & PINAFORE LENGTH: Measure from nape of neck to length required.
